CURRICULUM VITAE

Yannis Prelorentzos (PhD, Sorbonne-Paris-IV) is Professor of Modern and Contemporary Philosophy at the University of Ioannina (Greece), where he is teaching since 2000. He is the author of *Temps, durée et éternité dans les Principes de la philosophie de Descartes (1963) de Spinoza (1996)*, and *Knowledge and Method in Bergson* (in Greek, 2012). He has also published a long series of substantial articles, in French and in Greek, on topics in the history of 17th, 18th, 19th and 20th c. philosophy. He has translated and commented the central books of Plato's *Republic* in French (3rd ed., 2007), and Descartes' *Passions of the Soul*, Bergson's *Creative Evolution*, Deleuze's *Bergsonism* and Benjamin Constant's *Adolphe and other novels* in Greek. His principal interests lie at the main aspects of the work of 17th century rationalist philosophers (especially Descartes and Spinoza), of Rousseau's, Bergson's, Sartre's, Merleau-Ponty's and Deleuze's philosophy, at philosophical approaches of passions and emotions, at the various interpretations of Socrates in Modern and Contemporary Philosophy and, most recently, at 19th and 20th century French philosophy.
